About Judy Dewey

After graduating from the University of Durham, where she specialised in Anglo-Saxon history, Judy Dewey taught in London before moving to Cholsey in 1972 to be Head of History at Didcot Girls' School. She is now a part-time lecturer for the WEA and Oxford University Department for External Studies.

She has been researching Wallingford's history for 35 years and, with her husband Stuart, co-founded The Wallingford Historical & Archaeological Society and, later, Wallingford Museum, of which she is Hon Curator. Together they publish local history books as Pie Powder Press, including a number of their own works. Judy's particular interests lie in the Saxon and Medieval town, the Civil War period and the overall progression of the town's development.

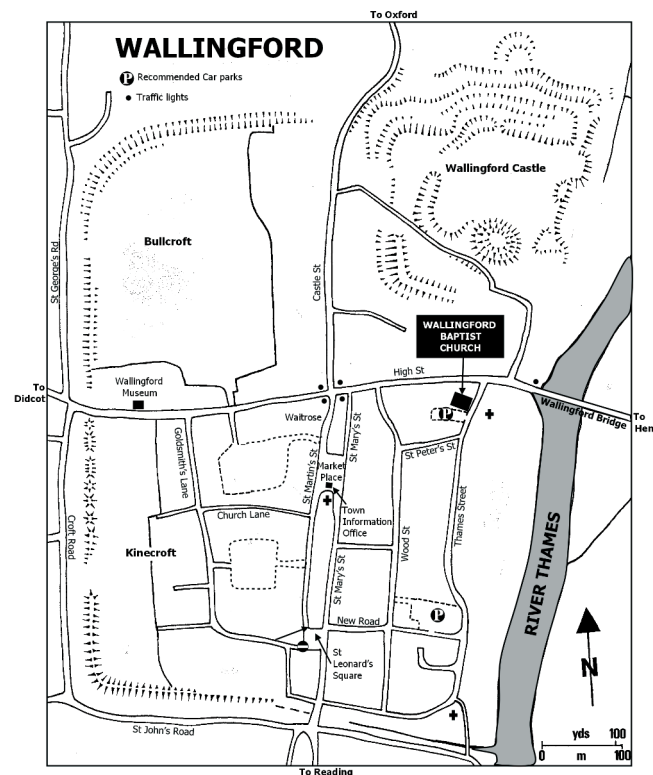
